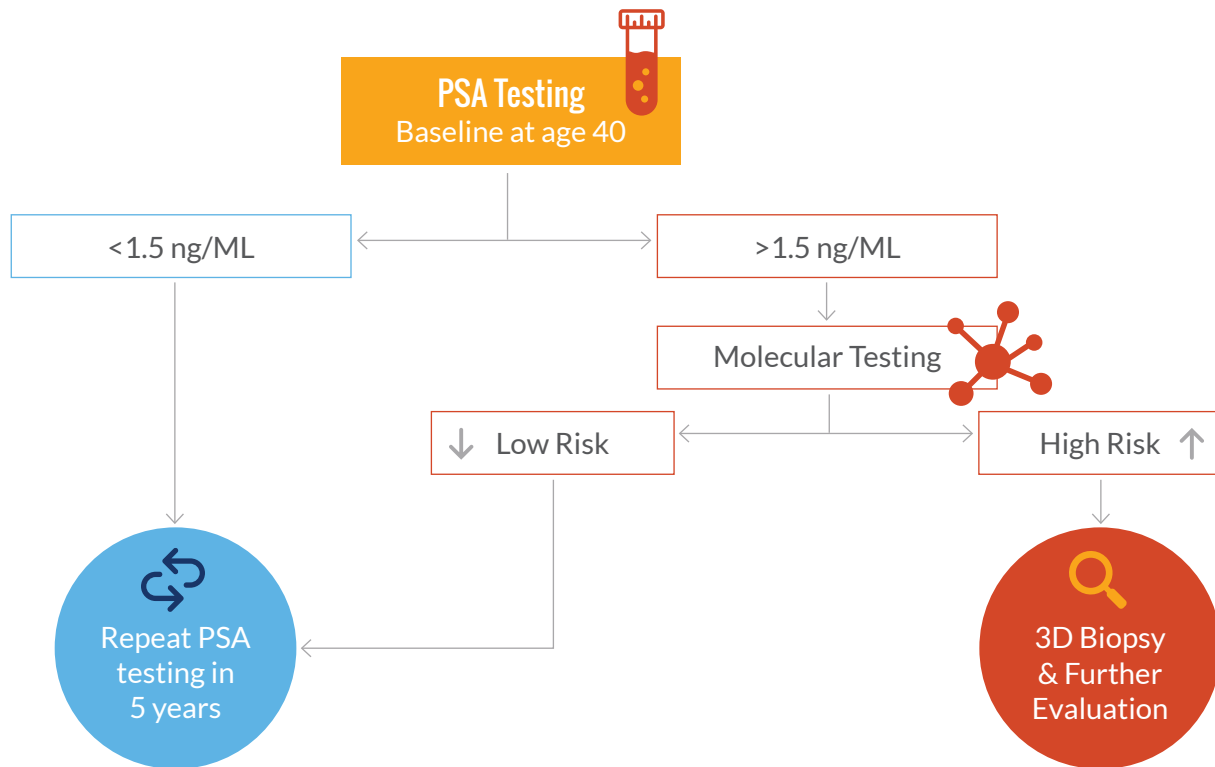




PSA Testing Recommendation

At Precision Prostate Cancer Center, we recommend that all men obtain regular PSA testing to check their prostate health. Men who receive a PSA test result of 1.5 ng/mL or greater should consider further evaluation. PSA levels above 1.5 can indicate the presence of either prostate cancer or non-cancerous (benign) prostate conditions such as BPH. While many men—particularly with PSA test results above 4.0 ng/mL—will be referred for a prostate biopsy, we recommend that the next step of evaluation is blood and urine testing that measures the levels of biomarkers for prostate cancer. These tests, called Prostate Cancer Markers (PCM™), look just for prostate cancer and the likelihood that the cancer will grow and spread rapidly. These tests can then indicate whether a prostate biopsy is the right next step.
